Tarago Show – 2 March 2014 By Lawrie Nock

We received almost 6.5 mm (1/4 inch) of not quite flooding rain over 24 hours to Sunday morning. This was follow up to the 0.5 and 1.0 mm efforts on the preceding days. Beautiful rain, just enough to prevent outside activities and dampen the prospects for Sunday.By Sunday morning the almost flooding rains of Saturday had passed and the rain had become just enough to settle the dust. We set out under a sky of blue and broken cloud.

First stop was Dickson to meet with an unspecified number of guests from the Chinese Embassy who were coming with us to experience a country



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show and especially, the shearing of the sheep. Paul and Fay Cunneen were already at Bungendore in the little 7Y Ford when we arrived. By the time we left Bungendore, our convoy had grown into a respectable 9 vehicles plus one Diplomatic vehicle carrying a child in the required child restraint.

On arrival at Tarago we were met by some more of our guests who had brought their own transport so they could return to the office early. Entry into the grounds was a bit of a mess due to misunderstandings between the gate keepers, the organizers and ourselves. An apology was received for the misunderstanding but the consequences were not able to be sorted out properly.

We parked under the trees next to the old engine club members. On arrival, our members quickly located the food and coffee vendors. Horse events were already under way. Tarago experienced very light rain, similar to that we did at this end of the district during the week, but for the whole week. The failure of the rain to let up during the week meant that by the weekend the sheep were pretty thoroughly damped down. Shedding the sheep before the rain started was not an available option.

Our Chinese guests were disappointed to learn that the shearing competition

had been cancelled. The disappointment provided an opportunity to explain the process of harvesting wool along with why wet sheep are a problem and how we usually avoid the problem. Opportunities for replacement events were—available. Despite the numerous horses we had brought along, we were not permitted to participate in any of the events. A historic vehicle gymkhana in the arena could have provided some consolation for the cancellation of the—shearing, but they didn't seem to be interested in this wonderful opportunity which our presence generated.

Throughout the morning our invited guests continued arriving. So did members of the public, some of whom became quite excited about cars such as David and Gill's Mercury. Bill was offered a truck load of rims for the Landy. One knowledgeable visitor knew how many additional valves Rolls Royce had managed to implant into the GM automatic transmissions to turn them into a mechanic's nightmare. Another observant member of the public noted that "Priscilla" is "very pink." The KarmannGhia turned up to add to the spectacle. This ensured that the German marques won the day for attendance, with the Ghia, two Bentleys and the 450SLC. One advantage of globalization of the motor industry is that those with binational cars can choose which nationality they hold and change status whenever the circumstances are convenient.



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We made a number of trips back into Tarago to locate lost guests and escort them to the Showground. At the end of the day I think about 5 embassy vehicles entered the Showground carrying children, who could not have been transported in any public place in any of the cars we had taken. This was my first real experience of the impact the recent changes to road rules relating to carrying children in historic cars, can have on running an event.

Our guests seemed to enjoy their experience. Mel was seen participating in the folk dancing. All of the Chinese children ended the day wearing face paint – they wouldn't let me into the queue to get mine done. Some of the embassy staff who attended also brought with them their parents who are holidaying in Australia. For most it was a new experience to be travelling in the country away from the major highway corridors and being present at a genuine small country show. It was suggested to some of the Chinese that they could submit a team for the tug o war. The size of the other entrants might have given them a message that in a team event limited by numbers, as for this type of event, size matters. For those who travelled in our cars it was their first experience of that type of transportation.

By about 2.00pm many of our members were on the road with the exception of the hard core social group who had settled in to support the Dutch pancake supplier.

A bit disappointing that the sheep shearing was off, so it was a small sleepy country show with horse in the distance. We parked next to the stationary engines which were allowed to run for 6 minutes, the organisers didn't want the horses frightened! All in all a nice run for Lady of about 140km there and back.

WHEELS 16 March 2014

Not the best week leading up to Wheels with rain or showers predicted for every day including WHEELS day. On the day however we started out with some blue sky and a prevailing wind which was hopefully sufficient to keep the rain at bay. The early starters arrived about 7.00 ish and took over our allotted plot. Some of the STHARC cars were planted in the public car park adjacent to our site and the Rolls site so that the Rolls club could take them up in the event of what turned out to be an unrealistic possibility of a major turnout of members. Those involved in the marshalling got to see everything at closer range.

The STHARC site, while on a slope provided members with a commanding view over arrivals for CAMC, Mercedes Car Club and the RROCA. There were other participating vehicles coming through and most of them needed to do a double pass and get out the same way they came in to access their sites from Parkes Way. Twice the enjoyment for STHARC onlookers.



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The special participants were the touring Silver Ghost Association cars. About 20 Silver Ghosts arrived to take up a position on the shores of Lake Burley Griffin. Over half of the cars were from overseas and for some of the tour group it was their first visit to Australia. The Poms felt quite at home in the cooler prevailing wind throughout the day and the lushish green countryside.

Proximity to the food and drinks stalls and public facilities was a real plus for STHARC members. Council of ACT Motor Clubs has already had very good reports from other participants about the use of Kings Park with some degree of certainty about site availability in future years easily outweighing the rugged mountain ranges aspects. Some issues relating to administrative changes were identified and should be easily fixed for next year. Council will be looking for feedback about the site from participants through their club delegates.

The social group settled in for its gathering while other members took extended tours of inspection of the 1000+ cars estimated to have been present. Despite the absence of some of our regular attendees, the turnout from STHARC was quite impressive. People such as Stef van Der Plaat, Chris Forsey, Chris O'Rourke, Albert Neuss, Pauline Campbell, Charlie Adams and Ken Hearne were unable to be in two

places at once but it was good to see them present. A total of more than 20 member vehicles ensured a good display of STHARC vehicles.
