It just about flattened him as the bale really shoved Ron back! It must have been an interesting expression when Ron peered around the other side of the bale.


A cow with a smirk on it's face, had it's head down ready to send the bale back for a fourth time!

Observation Run and Fire Museum Visit - 8 August

A chilly, foggy morning on the Southern Tablelands. Would it deter the STHARC enthusiasts? Not at all: a large group turned up at the guide hall in a wide diversity of vehicles, for the first event of the new club year.

We began with the observation run, and Maureen and Anne soon briefed the group on details. The run began in the dead centre of Queanbeyan (the old cemetery), then led us past everything from schools and fast food shops to architectural delights, statues, and businesses owned by STHARC members and supporters.

What started as an orderly convoy soon degenerated to random vehicles passing each other in opposite directions. Can anyone explain why that always seems to happen?

One requirement was for entrants to draw the owner of Seiffert Autos in Endurance Ave (who was not actually there for a "portrait sit"). There are suggestions that Albert will personally judge the entries, but there also is the concern that when he sees them he may renounce his membership.

Somehow everyone found their way to the reassembly point, then after some discussion about how to find the Fire Museum we headed off to the Old Forrest Fire Station in Empire Circuit.

Our hosts were waiting for us, with the doors open to display their gleaming red appliances.

Pride of the fleet is a 1923 Albion which was among the "first fleet" of fire vehicles in the ACT. Apart from the vehicles on display, at the rear of the Station was the workshop area with several more appliances in various states of restoration (and more awaiting). There also was the BBQ for our lunch.

Following lunch, Dave Macklin of the Museum gave a talk on the history of the ACT Brigade, the vehicles, and some of the equipment. Curiously, nobody volunteered to test the vertical rescue sling.

The old fire station building itself is heritage listed. It was a most interesting visit and, without doubt, the gleaming red paint and polished brass took many people back to earlier times.

The History of England's Fire Brigade

After our very interesting trip to the Canberra Fire Museum I decided to take some time to learn more about the history of the UK's Fire Brigade and when it was formed.

The first was formed in Edinburgh in 1824 under James Braidwood as Fire master. Manchester started its Brigade in 1828 and in 1833 the London Insurance Companies combined to form the London Fire Engine

Establishment and Braidwood was brought from Scotland to take command. Braidwood was killed in a warehouse fire in 1861 and was succeeded by Captain Massey Shaw. Massey Shaw issued his firemen with a new style helmet - the famous brass helmet - which became common all over the country. He was also responsible for many improvements in equipment such as steam fire engines and street alarms.

Under the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Act of 1865 the fire protection of London was handed over to the Metropolitan Board of Works and the Metropolitan Fire Brigade was born.

This was the fore-runner of the present London Fire Brigade. Gradually towns all over the country organised municipal fire brigades, some were full time but there were many volunteer brigades in small towns and villages. Although these fire fighting services existed, to a greater or lesser extent, in the rest of the country they were not compulsory.

Story of "Noddy" the 1953 FT3 Albion ANT By Ron Scattergood

Our association with "Noddy" commenced on April 1st 1995 when Anne and Ron attended a clearing sale on "Bogwood Station", between Canowindra and Cudal. The sale was conducted on behalf of the estate of the Estate of Keith McNabb. The Albion was part of a rather impressive line-up of desirable vehicles.

The McNabbs never sold a thing. It was a gigantic sale covering anything that would have been on the farm over the previous 80 odd years. Only one other person bid on the Albion and both of us were wishing the other one to the hell out of it. Ron outlasted him and the Ant was driven onto the Leyland and brought home that night. She was unloaded at our warehouse in Queanbeyan and never actually came to the farm until she emerged in her present state in 1998.

Most of the work on Noddy was carried out by our son, lan Scattergood, with specialised jobs going to local companies who were prepared to stop laughing and start repairing. These included Merve Robinson at Molonglo Brakes — who had far from kind words to say about the brake system, but just the same he reconditioned them. "This system was a ******** to work on forty years ago and it hasn't **** improved since". So said Merve.

The rubber rings which seal the tubes in the radiator were another story. Ian rang Kool Kore in Fyshwick to inquire and was almost speechless when told they had them in stock. "There was one of these working in Canberra about 30 years ago and we had to re-rubber the radiator, had to buy in a box of 200 rings and the remaining 146 are still here!!" Under the flag of another club, Noddy attended the Snowy Mountains Reunion Rally in Jindabyne in 1998. The trip down was OK but coming home was a nightmare. 10mph was the speed most of the way, holding up hundreds of cars (including the Prime Minister) on the narrow road between Jindabyne and Cooma.

At home the trouble was diagnosed as a blown head gasket and a new one was tailor made in Melbourne (\$140). This was fitted and lasted a couple of weeks and blew again.

Another gasket was made (\$140) and fitted, this time with heavy washers under the nuts on the studs. This has cured the problem and the engine has performed happily ever since. Her equipment is as follows

Engine – Albion petrol motor of 3600 cc 30 hp Gearbox – 4 speed crash box with extremely low first gear Diff – overhead worm drive

Tipper – G-well under-floor ram mounted between the chassis rails.

Top Speed – around 37 mph.

Sound-proofing – is not a feature. Anne won't ride in her unless the earmuffs are on board.

According to the Albion Preservation Society of Glasgow, Noddy is one of 16 known to exist in the world (restored or unrestored) and appears to be the only one known in Aust. Noddy's original owner was the Sydney City Council (Fleet #334) where she was used on general road repair duties. Sold off in the early 1960's to "Bogwood Station" where she was used as a general farm truck and in later years as a mobile wheat bin. Retired to a shed (thankfully) in 1992.

Now proud to be part of the Scattergood stable and probably the most "noticeable" vehicle in STHARC.


