A Restorer's Tale - Malcolm Stewart's 1982 WB Kingswood Coupe Utility



the car was "ready for paint" it seemed that there were dozens of things I needed. Raelene would have said "wanted". The problem here was to make sure that I got to the letter box first to recover the Australia post parcel notifications before Raelene saw them.

What I recall most about the restoration journey is that I learnt something new at every stage of the process. Sometimes it was as simple as "so that is how that part fits" all the way to reading manuals, online research and asking others "how in the world does that part fit?"

Let me start with the car itself. A mate of mine casually asked me if I would be interested in a Holden WB project that had been abandoned by its owner, (the project that is). A holden WB ute that had all the hard work done and ready for paint then straight back on the road, and all for \$800. Of course I wanted it. Pick it up Saturday and paint it Sunday register it Monday...."Bob's your uncle". That was five years ago.

The ute had been in the one family from new and had been worked hard as a tradies' ute. The bloke who owned it had dreams of "doing it up" and had put it in his garage in 1998. Over the next ten years he tinkered away upgrading the suspension and brakes while he started preparing the body for paint. He also added some bling in the form of brand new mag wheels and tyres worth over \$2000.

It was only when I headed over to pick up the WB that I heard how this opportunity came about. Sitting in the driveway was new SS commodore. The sellers wife who was there to celebrate the departure of the WB told me that the new car was the second car that had sat out in the Canberra weather because the garage housed the hubbies "project". With the new car she had given the ultimatum to her husband that the WB had to go.

Having got the WB home I encountered my first problem...no Garage! So started a two year building program where my plan to put up a simple double garage expanded to a 27 metre long shed covering 160m2.

I didn't however do nothing with the ute during this time. There was always E-bay to keep me occupied. Of course despite the fact that

So after a few short years I was able to get the ute into the new garage and start the rebuild which begins with pulling it apart. I am not sure which part I enjoyed more, pulling it apart or putting it together. I was determined to be organised so with lots of Jars, boxes and shelves I labelled most things as I took them off. The ute had come partly dismantled but driveable. Together with the parts I got I end-

ed up with enough bits and pieces to rebuild two cars. I spent the first few years tinkering.

The time finally arrived when I had to attack the body. I wanted to do as much of the process as I could but I had never painted a car before. I read alot of books and the more I read the more confused I became. I didn't feel like spending \$5000 plus on a professional respray and the car at 30 years old needed a fair bit of prep work. One problem was the primer/filler that the previous owner had liberally applied all over the car/tyres/glass engine was peeling and flaking off telling me that he had not prepped the old paint for the respray.

It was at this stage that a mate told me his brother in law was a car painter who was at home bored to death and who could give me some pointers on the respray. So I came to meet Larry, a six foot six American who met and married an Aussie girl 43 years ago on leave from the US marines in Vietnam.

The good news was that he was happy to help me however the car needed alot

of work including significant amount of the old primer effort being stripped off.

Larry hasn't been too well so he would pop out for a few hours every couple of days and so began a long journey of rubbing, priming, rubbing, filling, rubbing, filling and on and on. I had said to Larry that I would be happy with a "basic" job however Larry's professional pride mean't that there was no such thing in his vocabulary. It was a faultless job or no job. Larry and I have developed a close friendship and his support has made the whole project so much more rewarding.

The pictures I have attached tell alot of the story. Now to the car.

The **Holden WB** series is an automobile was produced from 1980 to 1984. It was a facelifted version of the Holden HZ series, which it replaced. Unlike the HZ and every other full size Holden series before it, the Holden WB was only offered in commercial vehicle body styles with no sedan or wagon passenger car variants. The long-Wheelbase WB series models were marketed under the separate Statesman marque, absent of all Holden branding. These cars were sold alongside the new Commodore.

Plans to produce sedan and wagon versions of the Holden WB reached an advanced stage but ultimately were not pursued.

The WB series was discontinued in late 1984. Production of the Holden WB and related Statesman models totaled 60,231 vehicles. No replacement for the Holden WB was offered initially, bringing to an end a continuous 34 year run of light commercial models based on Holden passenger cars. This market segment would however be contested by Holden again from 1990 when the VN commodore -based VG utility was released.

My WB was built in 1982 and was the top of the line Kingwood coupe utility. It had the largest engine available, a 253 ci V8 and a four speed manual. Options included power steering, air conditioning, sports dash, bucket seats, and sports steering wheel. I was happily surprised to find the original build sheet on the rear panel behind the seats. This confirmed that the car I had was pretty much the same however a new blue 308 had been fitted in 1995. The car also came with the original hand book with hand written entries for every service and oil change from new to the nearly

300,000 kms on the clock.



The car has brand new steering, suspension, brakes, exhaust, interior, carpet, and of course, paint. I dynamated the entire interior making it reasonably quiet and vibration free although the three inch exhaust, Holley 750, and mild cam mean that the big V8 is still noticable. The blue V8 came standard with electronic ignition and the car starts first time every time even after months of not turning over. I fitted a new stereo with DVD and bluetooth phone.....why not?

The car is still not quite finished with Larry booked to do a final sand of the 3 coats of clear put on top of 5 coats of white. We will then give it a full buff to get it to a mirror finish. Thanks to Jeff Gill for giving me the colour code to his pristine WB Caprice as I feel it is Holdens best White and I still hold out hope that he may one day sell me the Caprice so I will have a matching pair.....Then onto the Panel Van!!!

I also fitted a Caprice nose cone which is a pretty common conversion and makes the old ute look pretty commanding. By the way I dont even plan to try to put the old girl on historic rego. Besides the body mods the 10 inch rear wheels would give John Corbett a stroke.
