#### **Minutes of General Meeting - Tuesday 5 July 2016**

Meeting Commenced: 8.00 pm Held at: Guide Hall Erin Street Queanbeyan

**Attendance**: 34 members **Apologies**: as per attendance book

**Visitors**: guest speaker Mario Larocca on 3D design and component testing. The computer based testing of the engineering characteristics of vehicle components was demonstrated. Members had some questions about concepts such as seat belt fitting to older vehicles. The problem with merely advising on such matters on the phone was explained. Mario recommended that if club members had queries they should explain up front that they are from the club because he is unlikely to speak to them on technical issues otherwise. Mario offered to hold a workshop for club members on specific issues if we wished.

#### **President's Report:**

- Thanks Mario for the interesting presentation and the offer of assistance.
- The next club meeting will be the AGM where the Committee for 2016/2017 will be elected. Some of the current office bearers are willing to remain in their current positions but we have several positions which will become vacant next month and need to be filled by new people. The current occupants of the Editor, Events Director and Vice President positions are not available for re-election. The matter has been notified previously and we are now approaching crunch time.
- Members have to opportunity to choose a club person of the year. That decision needs to be made tonight so that the trophy can be prepared for the presentation dinner on 23 July.
- Membership renewals are now due. Payment can be made to the Treasurer or by EFT into the club's account. If you pay by EFT please remember to include your name in the reference section.
- The Registrar needs to update his records of club vehicles. The renewal form will need to be completed by individual members and provided to the Registrar. For ACT registered vehicles this information is essential if you need to renew your registration. For NSW registrations it is still needed. The increasing availability and use by authorities of vehicle registration identification technology means that the Registrar is increasingly likely to be

required by RMS to respond to queries about club vehicles identified on the road. A prompt response may avoid more complicated investigations. The Registrar is happy to accept this information electronically or in hard copy. Members also need to provide the Registrar with their vehicle log books so that the Registrar can work out who will receive the award for most travelled.

bought an S series Valiant four years ago. It is my 12<sup>th</sup> now and the third I have restored and brought back from the graveyard. I bought my first one at age 21 (me, not the car, it was only 16!). I guess I have seen quite a few of the 10,000 S series made during 1962.

The S was a stopgap model. Chrysler tested the market with the R series in March and the market loved their performance, comfort and driveability. Chrysler continued the knock down kit builds (fully imported kits) with the S during 1962 after the 1000 odd R series kits were completed and

sold. Local Valiant production commenced with the AP5 model in 1963 which although using some imported parts was manufactured locally and local content built quickly from 1963 on.

Today the R and S series are the most sought after of the early Valiants.

It's because of their relative





rarity and unique looks and performance.

Many thanks to Lawrie for helping me to pick it up on the car trailer from Wollongong. The car was reasonably priced and looked pretty good. The seller was a nice bloke interested in cars and had too many projects. It needed some work I knew but having had 12 of them before I knew the problems pretty well with this model and thought it would be relatively straightforward to get back on the road. Well it wasn't that easy and the repairs ended up taking 4 years!

The car needed all four footwells replaced, and there was rust damage to one of the window frames and the boot rubber channel. I welded all of the repairs in place with Paul Anderson's help. All new metal and then repainted the surfaces to match the car duco.

The engine just didn't want to run properly. It has been reconditioned in



the 90s and showed 160 psi compression a11 on cylinders. Ι sourced reconditioned carburettor, pump and fuel starter motor which I imported from Canada (Canada is where the RHD Valiants were built, the local cars assembled from were complete knock down kits at Chryslers plant at Mile

End, SA). Main problem was someone had fitted the wrong harmonic balancer to the engine from a later model slant six. I repositioned the timing mark on the balancer and the engine ran fine after a tune and sorting some wiring. Nice quiet and smooth engine now.

After repairing the floors painted them with sound deadener and S 11 preventer. I fitted new maroon carpet which looks good

with the red interior. Bit of a job to cut it to fit under the door jambs. The kick plates lacked all of the original screws, and were installed with just self tappers. It looked very amateurish. Local specialist bolt place provided the correct stainless steel round head screws to

finish the interior refurbishment.

New carpet also in the boot area. Then I reinstalled all of the seats and seat belts. Coming together nicely now.

Brakes were working sort of. Stripped them



down and replaced all the wheel cylinders and had the master cylinder resleeved. A final adjustment of the brakes and handbrakes had the car stopping straight.

# I gave the whole car a buff and polish/wax. It came up nicely. Buffed the chrome with metal polish and the car then looked presentable from the outside.

Unfortunately the auto transmission died after about 300 km of driving, but before I could take it to *Chryslers on the Murray* at Albury in March. I had the auto reconditioned and the car now runs very smoothly. Its great fun to drive and gets lots of compliments.

The Alpine white exterior with white sidewall tires and chrome wheel trims all look the part. I took these photos on a sunny Sunday at Googong Dam, hope you like them.

I have had fun getting this 55 year old girl back on the road where she belongs but I decided to sell the S series and to focus on my Chrysler marine collection, and try to get my Chrysler ute going.

# It sold quiet quickly and I and the new owner were both happy **Cheers Steve**.

Wheatley was posthumously awarded the VC during the Vietnam War when he choose to stay with a wounded mate instead of escaping with his life. His medal is on display at the Australian War Memorial.
