# CARS & COFFEE DUBBO

**W**ith the late-2015 introduction of its 60-day-per-year log-book based historic registration scheme, there's been a huge increase in the use and enjoyment of classic cars in NSW. It's really taking the "driven, not hidden" mantra of classic car ownership to the next level and the reason for the many Cars & Coffee-type get-togethers, usually on a Sunday morning, in many cities and regional areas.

Dubbo in central-western NSW is the latest town to establish a regular Cars & Coffee. Started in June last year, the Sunday morning get-together in the centre of town is growing quickly as word spreads among the NSW Central West's car enthusiasts.

When we wandered in, we were greeted by more than 50 cool cars. Even though many of the entrants are wearing

historic registration, these events are not just for older classics – there was a healthy number of later model sport-spec Holden and Ford stuff there, too, such as a couple of later-model Falcon GTs and a particularly tasty bright red VX SS Holden Commodore track car. But here, as elsewhere, cool older stuff seems to be the core of Cars & Coffee and some of the owners brought their cars from homes more than 100km away.

Probably the coolest car on the day we were there was Hiram Marr's awesome old '63 Chevrolet Impala. Bought a decade ago from a local farm (it was a deceased estate) the Chev carries the character of a life well lived, from its bent headlight trims over its faded and heat-hazed paint to the crumbling door and boot sealing rubbers. Other cars at the event included a Suzuki Mighty Boy – yes, really! – and a handful of tough local rods. ☺

# Bentley Speed Six

In 1930, British motor company Rover advertised that it beat the world-famous 'Train Bleu'.

This was a luxury express train, and designed to take British aristocrats and celebrities from Calais to the French Riviera.

Following the advertisement, Captain Joel Woolf Babe Barnato, a British playboy millionaire and chairman of Bentley, wagered £100 that his Bentley Speed Six could beat the train as well. (Back in 1930, the average annual income in the UK was £165).

Originally, the Bentley Speed Six was introduced in 1928 as a more sporting version of the Bentley 6½ litre.

The vehicle's interior is made of red leather, velvet carpeting, and walnut trimmings.

The original version also had a champagne and crystal glass holder, but no namby pamby seat belts.

Despite being off to a bad start, Barnato managed to beat the train by a few minutes, but when the French authorities got wind of his exploits, he was fined for illegally racing and paid a hefty fine. The story became infamous and the Speed Six became a legendary vehicle.

The engine was restored to perfect running order, using original and custom-parts.

The boot of the car holds a beautiful surprise as well.

A fancy tool organizer, recreated according to the original specs.

The toolbox (not a metric spanner to be seen) folds up to reveal a red velvet trunk, with ample room for the discerning 1930's man of wealth.

The Blue Train version produced 200 hp, reached a top speed of 200km/h (125mph), and won the 24 Hours of Le Mans race in 1929 and 1930. In both races, the driver was none other than Barnato – the Chairman of Bentley Motors.


