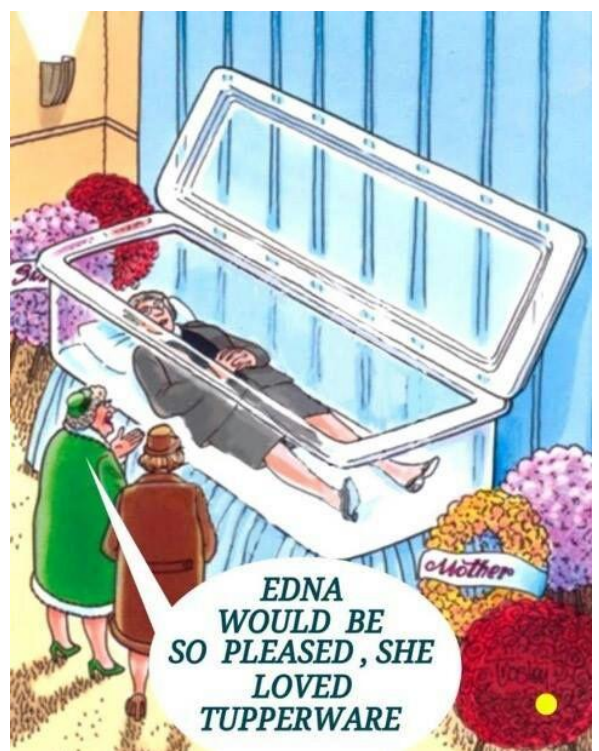

Friday 20 October 2017 to Monday 23 October 2017. GREAT EASTLAND HUB RALLY - ARMIDALE



If you have a product to purvey, this was the place to do it: but it seems the coffee van musta made a motza.

Four CHVVCC cars (Graeme and Lyn, Triumph Dolomite, Bill and Jane, FJ Ute, Pete and Nerida, Triumph 2500 TC and Glenn and Jenny, BMW E30,) set out for Armidale on Friday morning in bright sunshine. We enjoyed morning tea/lunch at Fusspots Café Ebor and regained our strength after the steep run up the Dorrigo. All members' cars performed admirably with Bill and Jane's FJ Ute setting the pace. But dark clouds on the horizon encouraged Glenn and Jenny to put the top up on the BMW for the next stage.

After booking into our motel we had a bit of a look around town and arrived for Registration at the Bowling Club. We learned that there were around 80 entries for the Rally and as usual, the Armidale Club made us all feel very welcome with a great spread of finger food followed by a yummy sausage sizzle. And the rain came down.

After a good night's sleep we did a bit of shopping and arrived at the Bowlo after lunch for the first run. This was to the historic mining town of Hillgrove which was named in 1888. Hillgrove was one of the major goldfields in New South Wales, with a recorded production of over 15,000 kg of gold. It has also been a significant producer of antimony.

What, I hear you breathlessly ask, on earth is antimony (well at least those of us including me who paid little attention to Chemistry classes at school!!!) so here is a definition - *a trivalent and pentavalent metalloid element with atomic number 51 that commonly occurs in a brittle, metallic, silvery white crystalline form and that is used especially in alloys, semiconductors, and flame-retardant substances* – bet your glad you wondered!

Hillgrove started to decline after 1900 and after the 1920s antimony prices declined leading to mining companies shutting down. Shortly after most of the town's buildings were dismantled and relocated to Armidale and other centres. Goldmining briefly resumed between 1937 and 1940. However, it was the *Damned If I Know Mine* (what a great typically Aussie name), a small operation which extracted tungsten ore between the late 1930s and the late 1950s which turned a large profit, due mainly to the demands of industry during World War II.

Characters from the Armidale Club put on a stage show in the Community Hall focusing on local historical characters which brought lots of mirth and laughter from the audience. Then more food and a visit to a large and fascinating museum recording local industry and inhabitants. A pleasant drive back to Armidale followed.

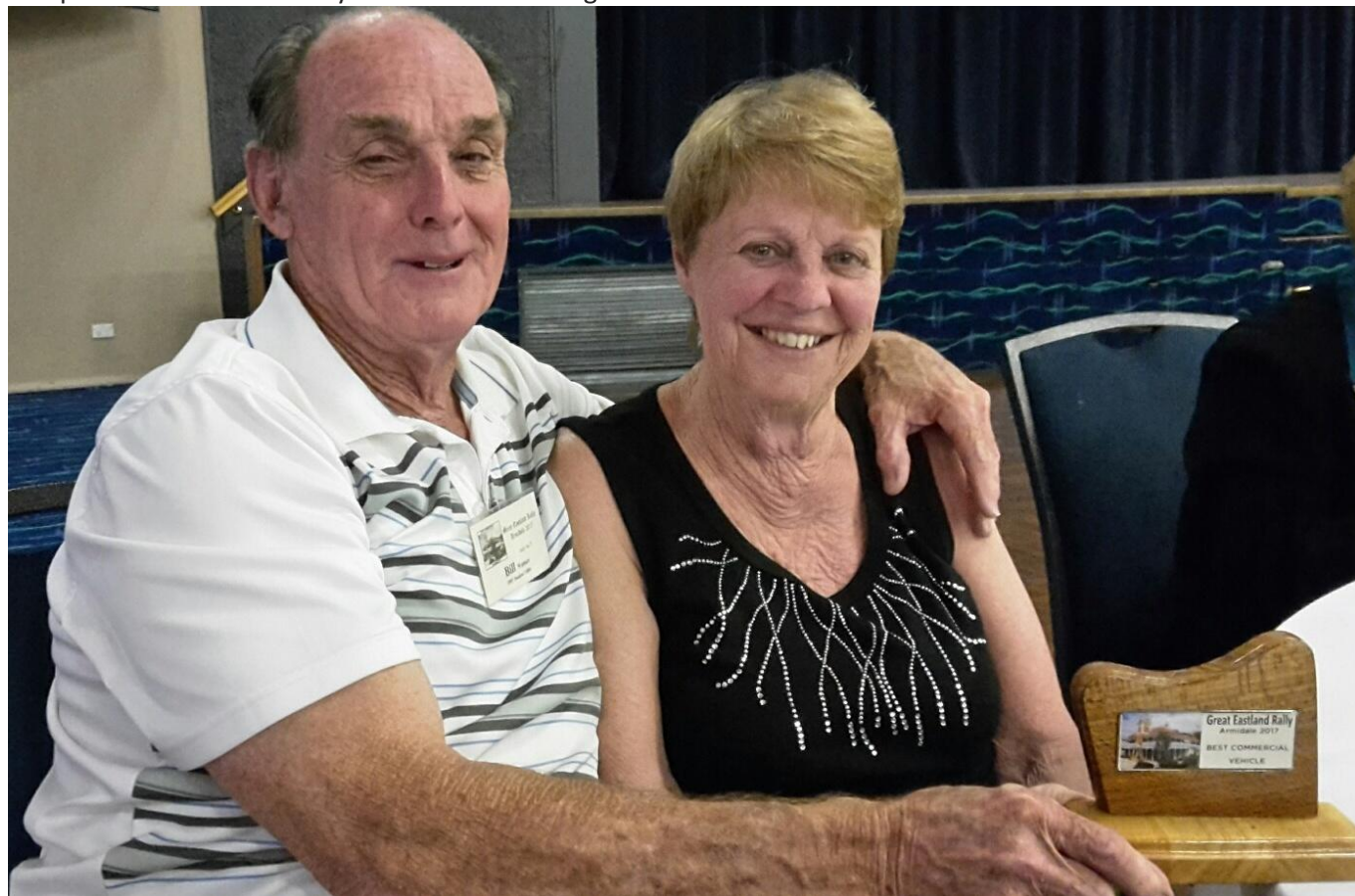
The evening meal was at the Bowlo, where the cold beer, wine and scrumptious food was most welcome. After enjoyable conversations with other guests and reminiscences about other rallies and cars (the ladies were in raptures) we turned in for another good night's sleep.

The next day saw us enjoy a fine day on a 150 odd km round trip to Walcha. The high country looked a picture with good looking pastures and healthy livestock (although Jenny thought the sheep needed a wash!). A fair was held at the Langford Estate along with the many stalls and attractions there was the judging of entries into the Great Eastland Rally! I was very tempted to try the climbing wall but there were too many children in the line-up so I had to settle for a Devonshire tea with Jenny, Pete and Nerida. We all went on a tour of the grand Edwardian house, Langford, a beautiful historic home still in largely original condition. The nephew of the current owner said that the house and land (around 40,000 acres in 1904 and was now 70 acres) had been built from the proceeds of a horse race where a tablelands country horse was taken to Sydney for a race and cleaned up!!).

A lovely lunch from one of the many stalls followed. The display of cars was very extensive but I was surprised to see just 2 vintage cars in the line-up, a similar number of 1930s cars and no veterans at all – something of a sign of the times I guess. We did our voting and fingers crossed for our CHVVCC entries! A leisurely drive back to the big (ish) smoke of Armidale followed.

The night's function was at the RSL club where we enjoyed a lovely meal accompanied by yet more yacking. The Armidale club showed a continuous loop of silent movies from the 1920s and some of us took a trip down memory lane and chuckled quite a lot at the heroic antics of the actors. After the last course, the President of the Armidale Classic and Specialist Car Club thanked all for their attendance and support and in particular, the local members who had contributed so much to making this rally a success.

The next Hub Rally (Rally by the Sea) will be hosted by the Hastings Auto Restorer's club, Port Macquarie and plans are well underway for the October long weekend in 2018.



And then it was time for the awards, and yes Bill and Jane can take a bow as the winners of the Best Commercial in show for their 1953 FJ Holden Ute, well done!

After an early start on Monday morning, we headed off to the Bowlo for our goodbye breakie. The spread was lovely and after a final chat we motored home. Unfortunately, Graeme's Dolomite required a repair after a coolant leak, and with the help of Armidale folks he and Lyn were soon on their way.

SOME MOTORING FIRSTS

1931 TO 1966

(continued from August Splutter)

- 1931 The first all-synchromesh gearbox was announced by the German firm of ZF.
- 1932 The first British cars to use synchromesh gearboxes were Vauxhall and Rolls Royce.
- 1934 The first electrically operated convertible was fitted to a Peugeot.
The first automobile overdrive was introduced by Chrysler.
The first British production model, to use automatic-transmission was the 18 hp Austin.
The first drive-in-cinema was opened in Camden, New Jersey, USA.
- 1935 The first man to exceed 300 mph on land was Sir Malcolm Campbell in Bluebird.
The first headlamp flashers were used on the Fiat 1500.
The first parking-meter was used in Oklahoma City, USA.
The first windscreen washers were introduced by Triumph.
- 1936 The first retractable headlights were used on the cord 810.
The first diesel-engined private car to be marketed was the Mercedes Benz 260D.
- 1938 The first racing car disc brakes were fitted to an Indianapolis Miller.
The first car to be offered with air conditioning was a Nash.
- 1945 The first post-war motor race took place in Paris.
- 1947 The first man to officially exceed 400 mph on land was John Cobb in his Napier-Railton.
- 1950 The world's first gas turbine powered passenger car was the Rover Jet 1.
- 1953 The first production car with glass fibre body was the Chevrolet Corvette.
The first radial ply tyre was the Michelin X.
- 1957 The first British car to win a World Championship race was the Vanwall of Stirling Moss and Tony Brooks
which won the British GP.
- 1958 The first British Motorway was opened at Preston.
- 1961 The first British car to sell more than a million examples was the Morris Minor,
- 1962 The first car to use an overhead camshaft driven by a cogged belt was the Glas S1004.
The first European factory to produce a million cars in a year was Volkswagon.
- 1963 The first car to use a rotary engine was the NSU Wankel Spyder.
The first gas turbine engine racing car, a Rover BRM, ran in a road race (the Le Mans 24-hour Race).
- 1964 The first man to exceed 500 mph on land was Craig Breedlove in his three-wheeled jet-propelled
Spirit of America.
The first gas turbine powered passenger car to be used by the public was the Chrysler Turbo Dart.
- 1966 The first production road car to use four wheel Drive was the Jensen FF.
